

Recycling centers are open!



All three of the County's recycling drop-off centers are now open!

Residents will be able to bring items to the recycling centers only during the posted hours of operation. See below for that information.

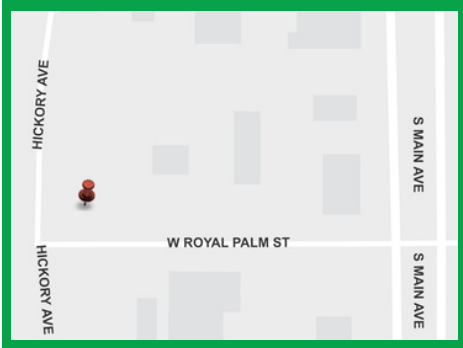
WHAT CAN BE RECYCLED?

- Glass
- Plastics (bottles, jugs, and jars)
- Steel, tin and aluminum cans
- Clean flattened cardboard
- Newspaper, junk mail, office paper (not shredded) and other non-coated paper

The plastic, paper, aluminum, and cardboard will all be combined into one bin, while glass will go into a separate bin. Bags used to transport recyclables to the drop-off center will need to be emptied and then disposed of as garbage (unless they are re-usable). **Plastic bags are not accepted.**

The on-site attendant will be able to answer questions, help residents deposit the items that can be recycled, and make sure the items are deposited in the appropriate recycling containers to avoid contamination.

Lake Placid's site opened 6/1.

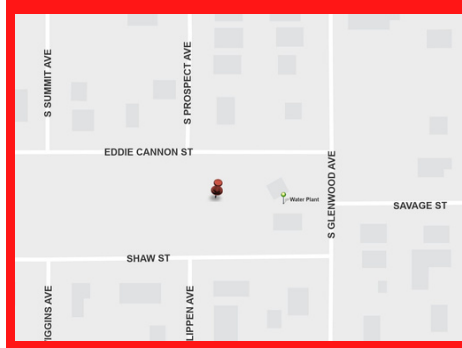
WHERE:

Avon Park's site opened 8/1.

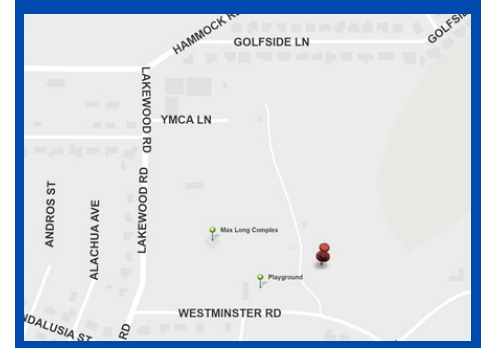
WHERE:

Saturdays from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m.

At Max Long Recreational Complex, using the entrance off Westminster Road

OPEN:

Tuesdays and Thursdays from 2-5:30 p.m.

Saturday from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.
